In addition to her time as AIPC President, Maple was also President of the Joint Meetings Industry Council (JMIC) from 2005 to 2008. During that period, JMIC expanded its role in industry advocacy and developed the Profile and Power program which provides industry organizations with resources to promote and explain the benefits of the industry to community, business and government audiences. She was also Chair of the World Council of Venue Management, and continues her organizational involvements through such roles as Chair of the AIPC Academy for professional development.

The Joint Meetings Industry Council was established in 1978 as a vehicle for the exchange of information and perspectives amongst international associations engaged in various aspects of the Meetings Industry. It is now a leading industry advocacy body whose membership includes the majority of international industry organizations.

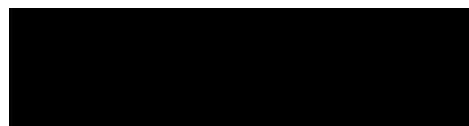
